All students are encouraged to participate in the district's annual summer literacy and math project that provides engaging ways for students to practice reading and math skills and encourages lifelong readers and mathematicians. All of the projects center around student choice and are designed to be authentic in nature. Part of the literacy project includes one required read modeled off of the national campaign of *One School, One Book* called *One School, One Theme*. This campaign aims to build a community of readers within our school as everyone – students, teachers, and

even administrative staff – read the books. This summer, the theme is **Courage Counts**. The elementary stories selected are available at both the primary and upper grade levels. The primary (grades K-2) books are *I Am Courage: A Book of Resilience* by Susan Verde and *Jabari Jumps* by Gaia Cornwall. The upper elementary (grades 3-5) books are *Allergic* by Megan Wagner Lloyd, *Nubby's Story* by Aubre Andrus (or *Pumpkin's Story* is an additional chapter book option now due to limited availability), and *Wangari's Trees Of Peace: A True Story from Africa* by Jeanette Winter. Middle school students may choose their one required reading from four book options: *Allergic* by Megan Wagner Lloyd, *Bee Fearless: Dream Like a Kid* by Mikaila Ulmer, *The Crossover* by Kwame Alexander (students may read the book or graphic novel, and *When You Trap a Tiger* by Tae Keller. Teachers annually start the school year off celebrating student summer work and integrating book themes into back-to-school routines.

The purpose of the <u>Division on Civil Rights' 2022 Youth Ambassador Program</u> is for students to develop a rich understanding of civil rights in order to enhance their communities, participate in civil rights-related conversations, learn how to amplify their voices, serve as a community liaison to DCR, and work on projects that can be added to their portfolios/resumes. The Youth Ambassador Program prioritizes youth empowerment by focusing on skill building in various areas, creating opportunities for project development, enhancing personal growth; promoting diversity and self-awareness, generating opportunities to establish additional support networks, and encouraging students to act as community change agents through education on the Law Against Discrimination. Youth ambassadors can reapply every year, and those who participate for two or more consecutive years can serve as mentors to newer youth ambassadors to promote connections within their respective communities, counties, and across the State. The New Jersey Division on Civil Rights Youth Ambassador Program is open to all youth ages 13
